

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

wordsearch. The free site licence allows you to put the interactive crosswords on any number of networks and standalone computers, and to print off any number of crosswords for use within the site. This resource is aimed at pupils aged 11-14 but also provides a firm basis for external examination courses for pupils aged 14-16.

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
